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THE OIL WORKERS PROTESTS ARE GOING ON DAILY IN IRAN

On Monday, November 6, as well as the previous day, the formal oil workers, working in the Aghajari Oil and Gas Exploitation Company, gathered in protest against the government's livelihood attacks and non-response to their demands. The workers of this company have been protesting every day. The formal oil workers working in the Southern Oil Regions Company located in Ahvaz, Falat Ghareh in Khark Island, and the Falat Ghahre in Siri region held a protest rally. The formal workers of different oil regions have announced Sunday, Monday and Tuesday as their fixed protest days until their demands are met.

On the other hand, 150 workers of Chah Bahar Petrochemical Company went on strike to protest the non-payment of their wages for more than 5 months by stopping work and preventing engineers from entering the company due to non-payment of their five-month arrears. Mass protests in oil are the basis for the nationwide protests in this key economic centre. These protests have a direct and positive effect on the balance of power and the strengthening of workers movement at the community level.

In this regard, seven organizations of workers, pensioners and women's rights organizations declared their support for the oil workers' protests. The protesting workers need solidarity and support by all workers and humanitarian organisations.

Hamas and Netanyahu must be tried for war crimes

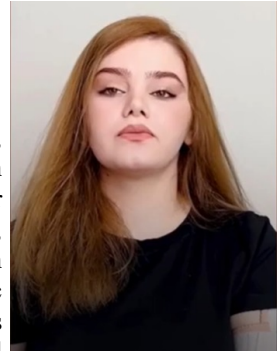
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This genocide must stop! Ceasefire now!

I was hit by around 300 pellets

Hello. I am Sima Morad-beigi, 26 years old, and I was born in the town of Bukan. On October 13 2022 during the Woman, Life, Freedom protests, an officer of the Islamic Republic shot me through the metal bars of the gates of Bukan hospital without any distance between us.



He pointed his weapon through the bars, right at my hand. An image I'll never forget is that we were eye-to-eye with each other. I thought he wanted me to run away. But right then, he shot me. I barely managed to flee the scene. After that, going to the hospital was very challenging for me [for security reasons]. So I went to the home of one of our town's doctors. They couldn't help me. After that I want to a clinic in the Bukan clinic. I saw my shattered bones sticking out from my sleeve. They couldn't stop my bleeding at the clinic, so I want to the main hospital in Bukan. In the Bukan hospital, I couldn't see anything. All I heard was a nurse crying and saying my hemoglobin level was at 3, and I needed a transfusion and hospitalization. But they refused to treat me, so I headed to Orumieh. In the Orumieh hospital, if it wasn't for the help of some doctors there, they wouldn't have admitted me. It was tough getting admitted.

During this ordeal, I was hit by around 300 pellets. I underwent surgery three times, and my elbow joint was removed entirely. After I returned to my town, two days later, the intelligence forces had been to our house. I was at my mother-in-law's that day, and they gave us the news. We immediately left Bukan again and headed to Orumieh. We lived in hiding for about five months and then were forced to leave Iran. The one thing I can say is that the only thing they can't take away from us is hope with our bare hands, we have terrified and destabilised the Islamic Republic. Our only weapons are hope, resistance, and struggle. Here's hoping for a safe and free Iran for all of us. Here's hoping for a return to our country. Women, Life, Freedom.
